Location: UCA 3400




Dean's Office in College for Admitted Major

Set Up Delegated Access for Family

Students cannot share their FSU login!

Delegated Access:

- Allows others to view your class schedule, grades, transcript, financials, etc.
- They create their own login.
- You can grant or withdraw access at any time

Track Degree & Major Requirements


120 Credits in Most Bachelor's Degrees

- Liberal Studies Gen Ed courses + university graduation requirements
- Major requirements
- Some electives for major & Liberal Studies

Liberal Studies - Foundation for Degree

- Subjects: Math, English, Science, History, Social Science, Humanities, Ethics
- Skills: Writing, Digital Literacy, Oral Communication

Transfer & Accelerated Credit



Accelerated Credit from HS

Applied to Gen Ed if applicable or the major if appropriate

Test credits post to transcript - no grade

Dual Enrollment credits post to transcript with letter grade



Action Needed!

Send final official transcripts for HS and dual enrollment/transfer coursework

Check in September to ensure credits have been applied




Academic Program Guide

Expect Grades @ FSU to be Different

4.0 scale for GPA

$$A = 4.0 \text{ (no A+)}$$

$$B = 3.0$$

$$C = 2.0$$

$$D = 1.0$$

$$F = 0.0$$

+/- = 0.25 up or down

No weighted grades No grade "forgiveness"

Academic Standing

- FSU GPA is used for academic standing
- 2.0+ FSU GPA for Good Academic Standing
- Overall GPA is used for Bright Futures, admission to major

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Take a Full Credit Load to Reach Goals

- Fall and Spring: Take 15!
 - Most courses are 3 credit hours
 - Ideal = 14-16 credit hours



- Summer B Admits: 6-7 credits (6-week term)
 - At least 2 courses for best start to FSU GPA
 - Must take classes in Summer B to meet conditions of admission

Register Promptly & Before Finals!

Course Registration = Adding Classes for Next Term Enrollment Appointment = Your Time to Register Know Your Assigned Enrollment Appointment



- Posted in myFSU when the registration guide goes live
- Resolve holds before your appointment date
- Register the day of your enrollment appointment

Registration for <u>next term</u> closes after grades post

Verify Classes During Drop/Add

Saturday before classes start to 4th day of classes

- Drop/add is your time to make schedule adjustments
- Closes 4th day at 11:59pm verify your schedule!
- Adding classes after 4th day is <u>NOT easy or guaranteed</u>

First day non-attendance drops

- Student must be present the first day of each class or will be dropped by instructor
- Don't <u>count</u> on admin drop for unwanted course check!

Grades & Course Drop Options*

7th Week Course Drop Deadline (prorated for summer terms)

- Some may be able to drop courses by Friday of 7th week
- No course refund unless approved for medical/mental health withdrawal
- State law requires Bright Futures students to repay funded portion of class

12th Week Course Drop Deadline (11th Week for Engineering)

- Some may be approved by the dean for late course drop by Friday of 12th week
- Same payment stipulations as above

Any Week of the Semester

Contact dean's office for student crisis or medical/mental health reasons

*Scholarships may impact course drop eligibility -

Be Aware of Excess Hours Surcharge

Applies to credits beyond 120% of required degree hours

Most degrees are 120 hours so threshold = 144 hours

Does NOT Count	DOES Count
Accelerated Credit (AP, IB, AICE)	Failed & Repeated Courses
HS Dual Enrollment	Dropped Courses (after Drop/Add)
Second Major (if completed)	Unnecessary Credits from LATE Major Changes



Attend All Classes (unless sick or excused)



Academic Calendar

Lists when classes begin/end, finals, university holidays

Posted for each semester



Excused Absences
Require Documentation

Illness

Death in the family or other documented crisis

Active military duty, jury duty, or other approved/documented reason
